

Healing from the inside

Travis found God's victory over addiction. Thank you for making it possible!

"My circumstances haven't really changed all that much, but inside, my thinking has changed."

For Travis, life restoration has been less about fixing things on the outside and more about healing from the inside.

For years, he had carried around invisible wounds from trauma and depression. He had always dealt with the pain the only way he knew how — through drugs. First, it was pain pills. Then meth.


"I felt worthless."

He tried going to rehab a few times. One place even stuck out in his mind for introducing him to Jesus, and he was able to stay clean for a little while. At one point, his life seemed normal. He had a wife and child and was working a good job as an electrician's apprentice.

Then COVID-19 hit.

Travis was laid off. He shares, "When I was laid off from work, I felt worthless. I felt like I needed to provide for my family. I got really depressed about that. I started drinking, which for me always leads back to pain pills."

I started draining our bank accounts, selling my wife's stuff, my kid's stuff. Doing anything and everything I could to get that next pain pill."

When Travis's wife discovered what was going on, she told him he needed to go back to rehab. Unfortunately, nothing changed. "I was still on drugs pretty much," Travis says.

Hitting rock-bottom

Eventually, Travis and his wife decided to separate. On his own, Travis's addiction quickly escalated.

Just before coming to KARM, Travis says, "I had been on meth for 8 days. I hadn't been asleep in 8 days. I hadn't showered in 8 days. I hadn't really eaten in 8 days. I was starting to hear and see things that weren't there."

Peace and joy

The delusions scared Travis enough to come inside KARM. Then, in a way only God could have arranged, Travis ran into someone he knew from rehab, who encouraged him to enroll in LaunchPoint. After completing the program, Travis went on to join KARM's Berea program,

where he has found new purpose working on the facilities team.

He's thankful now to be able to wake up each morning confident in the peace and joy of Christ.

Better still, he's working to reestablish his relationship with his daughter and to see her on a regular basis.

Today, the hopelessness Travis once felt is gone. He shares honestly about where he was before coming to KARM and where he is now, thanks to you: "When I got to KARM, I was completely broken. I felt like a failure. I was just so ashamed of what I had done to my life. I was really suicidal. I had no desire to live.

"When I wake up in the mornings, I don't want to end my life anymore. KARM has really changed my life. What's changed more than anything is what I think about myself. I am grateful."

Our 9-12 month Berea program has transformed KARM into a Work-Learn-Serve-Live campus environment, where students are either in class, working or performing community service. Upon completion, students have realistic short- and long-term goals and Biblically-based plans for their future, supported by skills for employment—helping them break the cycle of homelessness.

That day, I found myself thinking, *How long has this been going on?*

Just outside of KARM, we've seen people passed out, lying on the streets regardless of the time of day. Overdoses occur in front of our doors on a regular basis. Pimps and prostitutes conduct business in broad daylight.

How long has this been going on?
