Giving Tuesday is November 28! Join us for this global movement of generosity to unleash the power of people and organizations to transform communities and the world!

Mental illness is an ongoing struggle among many men and women who are homeless. It contributes to and exacerbates homelessness – creating a vicious cycle that can be incredibly difficult to break.

A staggering 49% of guests who meet with a KARM Care Coordinator say they have been diagnosed with a mental health disorder. Additionally, KARM staff estimate that 90-95% of homeless individuals would receive at least one mental health diagnosis if they were evaluated by a mental health professional.

KARM honors the sacrifices of our armed forces. No veteran should experience homelessness – much less during the holidays. Yet, veterans are at greater risk of homelessness than non-veterans. David is a former service member who struggled with homelessness before coming to KARM. We're proud to share his story.

David's military service included two 6-month deployments to Iraq. As a member of the United States Army, he was proud to serve his country. Still, he doesn't like to talk about his time overseas; those memories are too traumatic. He does, however, like to talk about walking and hitchhiking from South Carolina (where he grew up) to Tennessee for a fresh start.

"I had a good childhood, but in our small town, everybody knew everything about everyone. I needed to get away to start over – to make my life what I wanted it to be instead of reliving my past."

David joined the military straight out of high school. He served faithfully until his hand was severely injured in a car accident shortly after his second deployment. He spent time back in South Carolina and Tennessee before deciding to settle in the Knox area. He still had connections locally and was full of hope for his future, but when he arrived, he had nowhere to go.

"I spent the night outside of a church. The next day a woman from the church got me into KARM. That was 12 years ago," he says.

Through KARM, David was introduced to the Volunteer Ministry Center and was later part of our inaugural LaunchPoint class. Now, he lives at Flenniken Landing, which partners with KARM to provide permanent supportive housing. As he has gotten older, David has also received much-needed care for his medical challenges, including depression, anxiety and a type of muscular dystrophy. But perhaps most importantly, he has learned to trust in God and His plan.

"I am alive because of KARM. They were here for me when I needed them. I am thankful."



David has hope this Christmas. He wants to thank YOU for supporting his journey toward a new life – and for recognizing the sacrifices of all veterans. "It is true that all gave some and some gave all. Some people gave everything, including their lives, for the liberty and freedom to be an American. I hope people will continue to support our veterans."
